From the Pastor's desk

Dear Parishioners

At weekend masses recently I spoke briefly about the situation we, as the Catholic Church, are about to face with the upcoming legal proceedings against Cardinal George Pell. The positive reaction of parishioners has prompted me to include something of what I said in this edition of Parish Talk. It also indicates that this is something that is very much on the minds and hearts of us all as we know it will be a painful and testing time for us Catholic people.

It goes without saying that the sexual abuses within our church have provoked a tide of anger and disgust and in referring to this, what must be first and foremost in the minds of everybody, is the suffering and emotional and psychological pain inflicted upon victims of sexual abuse. I would hope that this is the case not only for the Cardinal as he defends himself but also for his lawyers and the journalists and media outlets. Unfortunately, I am not confident that this will be the case. The media will insist that it speaks on behalf of the victims. Sometimes this is true but what is more the truth is that media outlets are primarily concerned with selling their news. Some journalists will attempt to conceal any bias against our church, others, I am sure, will use this period as an opportunity to inflict as much damage as they can on the church because they are simply anti-catholic or anti Cardinal Pell.

We know our church is bigger than all of this and that our faith is grounded, not in the institution of the Church, but faith in Jesus Christ. I see this faith being lived out everyday by good people, like yourselves, supporting their parish, volunteering for charitable works, embracing the Sacraments, seeking Catholic education for their children and so on

Allow me to quote Geraldine Doogue who wrote recently in the Australian Newspaper: "...within all of this, we need to remind ourselves that our church represents far more than these stories and events: 700,000 school children in the Catholic sector, served by 82,000 staff; 66 hospitals including19 public hospitals run by church related entities. St V DePaul Society is the most extensive volunteer welfare network in the country and the church is the largest welfare provider outside government.

Some of the vulnerable people who have populated the Royal Commission have been, and will be. beneficiaries of these catholic services." I would add look at the work of Project Compassion and Caritas and look at local parishes and the faithful people who continue to live and celebrate their faith.

Some recent headlines have spoken of the church being in full-blown crises, suggesting that this charging of Cardinal Pell is some special climax that will blow the church apart. Such comments are made generally by people outside the church. Where do they think Catholic people have been over the past two decades and especially during the recent Royal Commission. I wonder if they called into one of our weekend masses, especially the 8.30am, and observed all the young families and their children and the music ministry in full swing, would they continue to report such.

A recent Sunday Gospel records Jesus as saying: "Anyone who does not take up their Cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me" Yes, we will have to take up our catholic cross. We will all feel shame, embarrassment, anger and disappointment. We need to support each other and remain resolute in our faith in Jesus Christ who continually calls us to witness to him in the world, in fine weather and foul.

As all of this unfolds in the days ahead, let us continue to pray for and reach out to those who have been abused and hurt by the sinful actions of abuse and ensure as best we can that such abuse does not happen again, be it in the church, in the workplace or in families. Let us pray for each other. It will be a time of criticism, embarrassment and hurtful comments. We have to cop that but continue to live faithful and good lives and thus give witness to the love and compassion of our God

What's in a name?



GodStart is a good start

Hello Everyone.

A couple of months ago now the GodStart team participated in the Stewardship Ministry Expo. Our display gave us the opportunity to provide information to Parishioners about the program. Although we didn't have many people wishing to speak with us directly, I feel that the Expo at least gave everyone the chance to find out more about the Ministries that are available here at the Sacred Heart Parish.

The latest GodStart news is that due to our numbers decreasing and no replacements being found, that the program won't be able to continue in the format that it has run successfully as for almost fourteen years. There are several options being considered as to how the program may be able to continue into the future. Hopefully a working model can be decided upon rather than ceasing this highly valuable program.

The idea behind the program is for the Parish to reach out to the families with young children, who may not, for a variety of reasons, feel comfortable attending Mass regularly or at all. We act as a link for those families, between when their child is baptised to when they move on to school, by visiting them once a year. The most likely outcome of the options being considered, is that the visiting of families will be replaced with the GodStart birthday and activity cards being mailed to the children. This is not a preferred option, but may be the most practical at the current time to allow the program to continue.

If you can spare a couple of hours once a month to keep the deliveries going, we need to hear from

you urgently. You can contact us via the Parish Centre.

Thank you to all of our GodStart team for their continuing contributions to this wonderful ministry, especially as our numbers have declined and the workload has increased.

Knights of the Southern Cross

At a recent Bunnings BBQ I was asked "What is the Knights of the Southern Cross" (KSC)? This is a question often asked. I said it was a Catholic Men's Group that had its beginnings over 90 years ago in 1919 when Catholics were being discriminated against in so many spheres of life, in particular the workplace - Jobs were advertised as Catholics need not apply"

Under the auspices of the Archbishops of the day, this group was formed of Catholic laymen who fought in many quarters of society, to combat such blatant discrimination and would have coincided with the Irish uprising and the potato famine as Irish immigration to Australia & North America was very high. The Orders charter was also to assist the priests and bishops of the day and at one point they

were known as "The Bishops Men". They worked to assist the parish and the parishioners.

Entry to the order was by invitation only and one of its criteria for membership was that members had to be practising Catholics, attend mass and the sacraments on a weekly basis. While some of those requirements are an ideal they are not as rigidly pursued in this era. They endeavour to live by the following Objects:

- 1. To promote the advancement of Australia.
- 2. To foster the Christian way of life throughout the nation.
- 3. To promote the welfare of its members and their families.
- 4.To encourage spiritual, social and intellectual activities among its members.
- 5. To conduct and support educational, charitable, religious and social welfare work.

Members make every effort to live their lives by The objects.

They assist their fraternal brothers and families in time of need.

Another of their strengths is their Economic base where they will assist other brothers and

their families with finding jobs, assisting with finding accommodation for family members who may have moved to a certain area and need assistance.

Raising money for Charitable organisations is another of their many works. Over the past five years members have sold raffle tickets for the Frankston North Rotary club who in turn rebate the selling organisation a percentage of the sales - Wodonga Branch has donated more than \$6,000 to the Parish over the past 6 years. They support many other charities and causes when funds are available and are not restricted to Church activities. The Uniting Care Christmas lunch, St. Vincent de Paul, Pro Life groups and others.

The order has changed its philosophy over the

years and certainly isn't the secret society it is sometimes purported to be. Our branch supports an Annual Dinner for the Priest Support Fund which assists Candidates for the Priesthood and retired Priests - this dinner has raised in excess \$1,000,000 over the years of it's existence. Non members are welcome to attend and it will again be held at Moonee Valley Racecourse in September - anyone wishing to attend should contact Rob Russell or Michael McCormick.

On a larger scale the Knights of the Southern Cross have aged care facilities, known as Southern Cross homes spread all round the nation with the nearest one in Corowa N.S.W.. The order is looking at bold new plans to enhance what is already a first class care organisation.

The branch meet monthly and are always looking out for new members.

We are excited to see our Horizon students grow throughout the semester and where their passion takes them.
