Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.

Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.





Sandhurst Youth Ministry is going to World Youth Day (WYD)



Sandhurst Youth Ministry is going to World Youth Day (WYD) in Lisbon and we couldn't be more excited. Expressions of interest are invited from young adults aged 18-35 to join the pilgrimage from <u>29 July to 11 August 2023</u>.

The pilgrimage group will experience the World Youth Day celebrations, including festival events, gatherings with young Catholics from around the world and the Final Mass with Pope Francis. After World Youth Day, we will enter a retreat in Avila, Spain, where pilgrims will have a chance to reflect on their experience. The Diocese of Sandhurst and Catholic Education Sandhurst Ltd are both offering significant sponsorships to pilgrims who attend WYD For parish-based pilgrims, the Diocese is offering half of the pilgrimage cost. Catholic Education Sandhurst will operate under their usual funding model where CES Ltd pays a third, the employing school pays a third and the pilgrim pays the remaining third. These sponsorships do not cover additional costs such as travel insurance or other personal expenses. More information is
