Mystery of Christ:

The Second Reading this Sunday is noted as a hymn about Christ. Paul, writing to the Philippians, includes this very early Christian hymn. The text both reminds them of the humility and suffering of Christ but also of his victory over death and his glory. It is now a hymn for us to sing of our salvation that reaches out to everyone.

Christ reverses the sin of Adam. Adam sought to be god-like, Christ emptied himself to be a human being. But God raised him high so now Christ may raise up all. There is a strong connection with this hymn and the four servant songs in Isaiah.

It is worthwhile to read them as a whole. The suffering servant songs are read at the Masses on Holy Monday (1st), Holy Tuesday (2nd), Palm Sunday and Holy Wednesday (3rd), and Good Friday (4th).

The words of Jesus from the cross: "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani" are in Aramaic, the language Jesus and his people spoke. These words are the first line of Psalm 21 (22): A psalm of "suffering of a virtuous man. It is the response to the Psalm in today's liturgy.


