

### Easter 2023 Message

In the words of the Risen Lord: "Greetings!" (Mt 28:9)

My dear People of God, sisters and brothers in Christ,

Dear Parishioners of the Wodonga Catholic Parish and Tallangatta and Corryong Parishes: It is not easy to face the death of a loved one.

The Blessed Mother Mary and the faithful followers of Jesus would have experienced this when they saw Jesus died on the Cross.

Yet, thanks be to the Resurrection of Christ Jesus, we know that pain, suffering and even death cannot have the final say in us.

This gives us hope. This is why Jesus said in his first resurrection appearance:

'Do not be afraid.'

But how can we not be afraid? When things such us a rising cost of living, unemployment, housing problems, war, economic instability, territorial conflicts, and many more are happening around us as we speak?

This is where hope plays a great role.

Hope assures that pain and problems are temporary while and joy is eternal with the risen Lord.

I remember, Easter Sunday evening last year, my family faced the pain of the death of my second eldest sister of Cancer.

Instead of celebrating the joys of Easter, we were organizing the funeral for my sister.

What helped us get through that is the fact that my sister was a great person of faith and the fact that for the 'faithful life is changed, not ended'.

We comfort each other with confidence that we will see my sister again in the light of Christ's resurrection.

In the light of Easter, hope means that despite pains in life, the cross we have to carry, the sufferings we have to bear, there is joy that awaits us in the end, if we let Christ be our light and if we let him be our friend as we go on our Emmaus walk of disappointment and disillusionment.

This is the essence of the message of the angel to the first witnesses of the resurrection in the gospel of Matthew (Mt 28:1-10). The angel said to the scared witnesses: 'There is no need for you to be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen.'

So the call for us is to look for the Risen Lord and endeavour to walk with him or more exactly, to have Christ walk with us in our life's journey.

For Jesus, it is not easy to see a loved one remain in a deadly path, so he took the path himself to get us out of it.

As Pope Francis would say: "Jesus experienced total abandonment in a situation he had never before experienced in order to be one with us in everything. He did it for me, for you, to say to us: "Do not be afraid, you are not alone. I experienced all your desolation

in order to be ever close to you." This is our God. And I hope and pray that we may grow even closer to him and to one another especially this Easter time.

May the Risen Christ strengthen our hope.

I hope and pray, you are all well and safe and have a grace-filled Easter season.

# **Liturgical Jottings: Incense Studs**

What an intriguing title – what are incense studs? We see them every day in Church.

They are the five brass or wax studs on the front of the Paschal candle placed in the form of a cross.

The priest inserts them in the paschal candle as part of the blessing of the Candle at the paschal fire during the Easter Vigil.

The studs contain grains of incense. While inserting the studs into the candle the priest prays:

1 By his holy 2 and glorious wounds, 3 may Christ the Lord 4 guard us 5 and protect us. Amen.

The accounts of the Resurrection according to John 20:1-9 or Matthew 28:1-10, Mark 16:1-7 or Luke 24:1-12 may be chosen for Easter Day or Luke 24:13-35 for Easter evening
