From our Pope: ~ Pentecost Homily 2022



Holy Spirit invites us to forget ourselves and to open our hearts to all. In that way, he makes the Church grow young. We need to remember this: the Spirit rejuvenates the Church. The Church cannot be "programmed" nor are efforts at "modernization" enough: The Spirit liberates us from obsession with emergencies. He beckons us to walk his paths, ever ancient and ever new, the paths of witness, poverty and mission, and in this way, he sets us free from ourselves and sends us forth into the world.

Looking at the Gospels:

"O breathe on me, breath of God, Fill me with life a-new" is a classical hymn written by Edwin Hatch in 1878 and published in 321 hymn books. Each verse begins with the same words: "Breathe on me, breath of God. The breath of God is heard at the dawn of creation (Gen 1:2; 2:7), it enlivens the dry bones in Ezekiel's vision (Ezek 37:9-10 – the vigil of Pentecost third reading) and Jesus breathes on the apostles to receive the Holy Spirit (John 20:22, Gospel) The breath of God is life-giving, renewing and it symbolises the coming of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost commemorates the marvellous acts of God from creation, resurrection of Christ, the inauguration of the new covenant and the birth of the Church.

The liturgy of Pentecost transcends time by constantly making present the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the gifts of the Spirit and the graces of the mystery on each one of us. The readings of the Liturgy of the Word are very familiar to us. May we hear them anew and let the words refresh us in our faith and actions.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth.

Quote for the Day

Let us not doubt that when on Pentecost the Holy Spirit filled the Lord's disciples, he was not giving his gift for the first time but was rather extending a gift already given. The patriarchs, the prophets, the priests, and all the saints of earlier times were nourished by the same sanctifying spirit. No sacrament was ever instituted, no mystery ever celebrated, that did not involve his grace. The power of his gifts had ever been the same, though the gifts had not previously been given in so great a measure. Leo the Great, Sermon 76

<u>Liturgical Jottings: Pentecost</u>: This feast that marks the end of the great fifty days of rejoicing of Easter. Its name is derived from the Greek "Pentecoste" – fifty days" and in turn from the Hebrew "Shabuoth or Chavuot", the feast of weeks. In one way we can say it is the first of the Christian feasts because it pre-dates Christ. Pentecost/Chavout was a feast of thanksgiving for the wheat harvest and in time came the feast of the celebration of the covenants given to Noah and Abraham and then to Moses at the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. Christians celebrate the feast as the giving or descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples (Acts 2:1-14). From Ascension to Pentecost the Collect Prayers give a particular emphasis on the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit brings renewal, gifts, unity and leads us to truth and eternal life.
