Prayer for the Feast:

Like Like

The Preface was especially written for this feast for the Roman Missal in 1969. It combines both the theological themes of Christ's self-offering for the unity of the human race and some more devotional language about the fruits of receiving the sacrament.

For at the Last Supper with his Apostles, establishing for the ages to come the saving memorial of the Cross, Christ offered himself to you, holy Father, as the unblemished Lamb, the acceptable gift of perfect praise. Nourishing your faithful by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity. And so, we approach the table of this wondrous Sacrament, so that, bathed in the sweetness of your grace, we may pass over to the heavenly realities here foreshadowed.

Looking at the Gospels:

This feast harkens back to the celebration of Holy Thursday. By way of the metaphors of food and drink, its readings provide us with a look at the mystery of divine presence. They first provide a picture of a God who feeds us. In the past God set a table in freedom, and then provided food that enabled our ancestors to survive. God fed those who were needy, not those who were worthy. Jesus offered sustenance to the crowds that gathered around him. It was not manna from heaven that he offered but his own flesh and blood as food and drink. This food and drink are the pledge of eternal life.

Those who eat this bread and drink this cup are caught up in a profound unity with God, a unity not envisioned in the wilderness experience. There is a new overlay of significance. Jesus' claim to give his flesh and blood was a bold one, Paul's seems even bolder. He states that partaking of the bread and the cup not only joins us with Christ, but actually makes us participants in the body and blood of Christ. Humanity and divinity are joined as one. The Eucharist is a sign of unity in another way. Joined to the body and blood of Christ, we are joined to each other. We are one body and that body is Christ. The Eucharist is truly a celebration of thanksgiving: thanksgiving for our transformation and thanksgiving for our unity. © Dianne Bergant CSA.

Liturgical Jottings:- Corpus Christi

The Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ has always been the object of great veneration. Two feasts express this veneration: Holy Thursday night and the feast of Corpus Christi (The feast of Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) this latter feast was introduced in the city Liège, Belgium in 1246. When a priest from that city became Pope (Urban IV 1261-64) he extended the feast to the universal church.

St Thomas Aquinas described the feast as a time to express the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

The Procession of the Blessed Sacrament carried in a monstrance either around the church or in the streets came later. The Rite of Exposition and Benediction of the Eucharist, as a devotional rite came even later. Only in the 18th century was an official rite approved for use in Rome.
