Pope Francis on Good & Evil, Wheat and Weeds



The Lord helps us to understand that good and evil cannot be identified with specific areas or human groups: "These are the good, those are the bad". He tells us that the boundary line between good and evil passes through the heart of each of us. Then Jesus teaches us a different way of looking at the

field of the world, of observing reality. We are called to learn God's time — which is not our time — and also God's "gaze": thanks to the beneficial influence of uneasy anticipation, what were weeds or seemed to be weeds can become a good product. It is the reality of conversion. It is the prospect of hope! Sunday Angelus 23 July 2017

Looking at the Gospel:

Today we hear how the Spirit of God dwells in all of us, helping us in our weakness. The first disciples had Jesus to explain the parables; we have the Spirit to enlighten us. It is the Spirit who helps us to interpret the teaching of Jesus and to be receptive to the challenges that they pose.

The presence of sinners in the kingdom of God is often a stumbling block to good people. There will be a time for separation and judgment, but the time is not now. This means that the righteous will have to live with the sinner and, even more challengingly, show them the same kind of concern that they show to others. The presence of sinners does not necessarily erode the quality of the kingdom. Rather, it provides disciples an opportunity to rise to the occasion of generosity and forgiveness.

There are two images of judgment in the readings. The one in the gospel is terrifying and decisive. The wicked are bound together into bundles and readied for burning. We must remember that this is a parable. In the first reading and in the psalm response the justice of God is said to be lenient, clement and kind. The power of God is demonstrated not in retribution but in mercy. God is said to be 'merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in kindness and fidelity', and repentance is a very real possibility. This is the image that gives us hope. © Dianne Bergant CSA

Our Parish - Our History

Post 1920's

The town of Wodonga grew slowly in the shadow of Albury and St Augustine's Church served the parish well. After World War II, the Post-War Immigration Program was developed with Bonegilla Migrant Centre as a first point of settlement in Australia. With employment opportunities with such things as the Snowy Mountains Scheme, many of these migrants settled in Wodonga. Many of these migrants had come from Catholic countries, and so

the Catholic population grew rapidly.

The gratitude of these migrants is remembered by their donation of the "**Flight into Egypt**" (heading towards the Southern Cross) stained glass window in the East window of Sacred Heart Church.
