# **Pope Francis:**



Pope at WYD Mass: Church and world need young people 'like the earth needs rain' In his homily for the concluding Mass for World Youth Day in Lisbon, Pope Francis calls on young people to shine, to listen, and to be unafraid. "We become luminous, we shine, when, welcoming

Jesus, we learn to love like Him. To love like Jesus: that makes us luminous, that leads us to do works of love."

# Looking at the Readings:

Theophany is not a word we use often, yet today we have the witness of two theophanies: God manifesting himself to humans. First to Elijah on Mt Horeb in the sound of silence and them to the apostles when Jesus calmed the sea and the wind. Only God has that power. We read: "they bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.' " (14:33) The parallel passage in Mark portrays great emotions not found in Matthew: they were terrified by the storm and utterly and completely dumbfounded by the miracle. (Mark 6:49,51). Elijah was much encouraged to now continue his mission, the apostles were beginning to recognise Christ.

Several times in the Gospel we hear Peter wanted to follow the Lord. He has great eagerness and faith but also has fears and misunderstandings. So many times Peter expresses out aloud what the others are thinking to themselves. Each Christian wants to affirm their faith, increase their trust and understanding so as to follow Jesus more closely. We rejoice in the epiphanies and theophanies moments, even when they are not as often as we would like.

## Did You Know?

Hills and mountains are often referred to where Jesus goes to pray. He prays alone or in company with a few. Interestingly there are no hills near the Lake of Galilee, Matthew's reference that Jesus went up into the hills has a metaphoric meaning rather than a geographic reality. It most likely indicates a time of quiet solitude and prayerfulness.

# <u>Liturgical Jottings- Night Prayer (Compline)</u>

Compline also known as Night Prayer, or the Prayers at the End of the Day, is the final prayer liturgy (or divine office) of the day in the Christian tradition of canonical hours, which are prayed at fixed prayer times. The English word is from the Latin completorium, as compline is the completion of the waking day. Compline is a part of Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Eastern Orthodox, and certain other Christian traditions. It tends to be a contemplative office that emphasises spiritual peace. In most monasteries it is the custom to begin the "Great Silence" after compline, during which the whole community, including guests, observes silence until first prayer in the morning. It comprises of an "Examen" of the day hymn, one or two psalms, a reading, response, the canticle of Simeon: "Nunc Dimittis" (Luke 2:29-32) concluding prayer and

### Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind.

In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified.

'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear.

But at once Jesus called out to them, saying 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.'

It was Peter who answered. 'Lord', he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.'

'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink.

'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him.

'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said,

'Truly, you are the Son of God.'
