Pope Francis on the Season of Creation 2023

Let us join hands and take bold steps to "Let Justice and Peace Flow" throughout our world. How can we contribute to the

mighty river of justice and peace in this Season of Creation? What can we, particularly as Christian communities, do to heal our common home so that it can once again teem with life? We must do this by resolving to transform our hearts, our lifestyles, and the public policies ruling our societies.

World Day of Migrants & Refugees:-Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees:

The theme for the 108th such event is "Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees". Pope Francis says no one should be excluded, adding that God's inclusive plan "gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries", especially migrants, refugees, displaced people and those seeking asylum.

The Pope encourages everyone, but especially young people,

to value and recognise the contribution migrants and refugees make to enriching the process of building the future together. Pope Francis has devoted his Message to the freedom that should always mark the decision to leave one's native land. "Persecutions, wars, atmospheric phenomena and dire poverty are among the most visible causes of forced migrations today. Migrants flee because of poverty, fear or desperation. Eliminating these causes and thus putting an end to forced migration calls for **shared commitment on the part of all**, in accordance with the responsibilities of each. This commitment begins with asking **what we can do**, but also **what we need to stop doing.** We need to make every effort to halt the arms race, economic colonialism, the plundering of other people's resources and the devastation of our common home.

"Today, in our parish, we give thanks for the variety of gifts with which our migrant & refugee brothers & sisters have enriched the tapestry of Australian life.

We pray that Australians will always work together to 'welcome the stranger'.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went.

At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same.

Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them,

"Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

Bendigo Marian Festival: The 49th Annual Marian Festival:

The Apostolate of Our Lady of Fatima of the Diocese of Sandhurst joyfully invites all members of the faithful to come and

join the celebrations of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima in 1917, and as she requested, to pray for world peace.

The **2023 Marian Festival will be celebrated at**Sacred Heart Cathedral Bendigo on October 15th.

Pope Francis recently called the Church to turn again to Our Lady of Fatima, when on August 5th as part of World Youth Day celebrations in Portugal, he led 200,000 pilgrims in praying the Rosary at the Shrine of Fatima. He spoke particularly of the need to pray to the Blessed Virgin for peace in the world. As the conflict in Ukraine continues and threatens to spread, we face other challenges to peace and harmony in the world, it is timely that we answer again the call of the Blessed Virgin at Fatima to entrust ourselves, the Church, and all nations to her Immaculate Heart which she promised would triumph and bring peace.

<u>Liturgical Jottings: Eucharistic Prayer</u> part 3: Institution narrative

"The Institution narrative and the Consecration, by which, by means of the words and actions of Christ, that Sacrifice is effected which Christ himself instituted during the Last Supper, when he offered his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine, gave them to the Apostles to eat and drink, and leaving with the latter the command to perpetuate this same mystery." GIRM 79d

This narrative is often worded differently from any of its forms in the New Testament. It recalls not only what Jesus said and did at the Last Supper with the Apostles but what the assembly is doing right here and now.

It draws attention to itself and is accompanied by ritual gestures: the elevations of the consecrated bread and the chalice and consecrated wine, that is, the body and blood of Christ and with the sounding of bells. Also the priest celebrant genuflects, concelebrants bow and the assembly joins in with acclamations. © 2023 Diocese of Sandhurst
