This week is my 3rd week of Studies at Tantur Ecumenical Institute. This place is just a walking distance to Bethlehem and Jerusalem. There are 14 of us doing this program. Nine of 14 participants are Catholic Priests from the USA (5),

Philippines (1), UK (1), Australia (1) and South Korea (1).





There is also an Anglican Priest from the There are two Catholic nuns from Nigeria and Hongkong respectively. There are also 2 lay Catholic women with us, one is a Scientist.

Some are doing it for 3 months and some like me are doing it for 6 weeks. For my first week here,

we studied the History of Israel and Palestine.

This includes excursions in Jerusalem and related sites. Our second week focuses on Judaism as a religion and as a culture.

This also includes excursions in Jerusalem and other relevant sites as well as opportunities to experience Judaism as a faith. Our third week is now focused on Christianity. This week, we left Jerusalem and spent 5 days in Galilee region (Nazareth, Tiberias, Capernaum, Sea of Galilee, etc).



It has been an interesting experience for all of us in the group. We have Mass everyday, prayer together, reflection time and sharing. I enjoyed the middle Eastern cuisine and hospitality. Saturdays and Sundays are free days for us, so on those days I would visit other holy sites that are not part of the program. This coming Saturday, I am graced to have the

opportunity to spend overnight at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre which contains the Calvary where Jesus was crucified and the place where Jesus was buried.

I have you all always in my thoughts and prayers here.

Please pray for me too.



Looking at the Readings:

In every life there is a struggle between obedience and disobedience, and this struggle takes various twists and turns. At times we are willing to conform to regulations set from the outside, and at times we are not. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. Those who are fundamentally righteous sometimes fall from grace, and people considered evil to the core sometimes reform their lives. What ultimately counts are not the promises made, but the actions taken.

We are called to discipleship, and there may well be urgency in this call, but it is an invitation that is to be accepted freely. As is the case with life itself, options are placed before us all the way along the road. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. However, the invitation always remains open to us because God's desire for our acceptance is persistent and enduring.

The real choice set before us today is the imitation of Christ. The specific characteristic of Christ today is His humility. Since demanding one's rights can undermine the loving quality of community, Jesus' humility is offered for our imitation. It is very clear that whichever aspect of discipleship we examine, some aspect of community is also present. To be a disciple of Jesus is to follow him humbly as a member of a believing community. © Dianne Bergant CSA.

<u>Liturgical Jottings - Eucharistic Prayer part 4</u> Anamnesis

The anamnesis, by which the Church, fulfilling the command that she received from Christ the Lord through the apostles, celebrates the memorial of Christ, recalling especially his blessed passion, glorious resurrection and ascension into heaven. GIRM 79e.

The Greek term "anamnesis" is the title to this part, though memorial prayer is regularly applied but does not carry the same dynamism of active memory and action. The prayer recapitulates what Jesus has accomplished for us and that we do this in remembrance of him. The Anamnesis in the third Eucharistic Prayer adds the second coming:

"Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice."
