Looking at the Readings

The Gospels of last week, this week and the next are from Matthew Chapter 25. Three parables that Jesus addresses to his disciples about the waiting for his return. They are the last parables and come just before the account of his passion, death and resurrection. Last week and this, the gospel insists on the urgency of active watchfulness since no one knows when the Son of Man will come again. The Gospel for next Sunday, the Feast of Christ the King, Christ has come, like a king to judge the people.

The celebration of these Sunday urges a fresh awareness for the essential and dynamic dimensions of the believer's everyday life and the way they participate in the liturgy. Like the bridesmaids in the parable last week, we want to be awake and ready, and like the servants in today's gospel we want to be diligent in our tasks allotted to us. And so may we participate worthily in these mysteries, for whenever the memorial of this sacrifice at the altar is celebrated the work of our redemption is accomplished. (cf. Prayer over the Gifts, Holy Thursday)

3. The Weakness of International Politics: There is need to provide a response to new problems and to react with global mechanisms to the environmental, public health, cultural and social challenges in order to consolidate respect for the most elementary human rights, social rights and protection of our common home. All this presupposes the development of a new procedure for decision-making and legitimizing those decisions. In this framework we require spaces for conversation, consultation, arbitration, conflict resolution and supervision. It is no longer helpful for us to support institutions in order to preserve the rights of the more powerful without caring for those of all. (42,43)

Book of Proverbs

This Old Testament Book is a collection of collections of maxims, proverbs and an acrostic poem (today's first reading). While many parts were written over a long period of time the final edition was probably 6th-5th century BC. The poem about the "ideal wife" (Jerusalem Bible) or "virtuous woman" (Good News Bible) seems anachronistic to modern ears. It is like a eulogy intent to give praise to the diligent person who is in wonder and awe of God.

Catholic Diocese of Sandhurst **Theology Scholarships:** Semester 1 2024

Designed to support the mission formation of parishioners through formal theological studies, especially those with or who are seeking pastoral leadership roles in the diocese of Sandhurst.

Are you interested in studying theology or spiritual leadership in 2024?

Scholarships are available for Sandhurst parishioners to study online post-graduate courses in theology at Catholic Theological College, Melbourne

50% of the tuition fees will be reimbursed (full cost: credit \$2,882, audit \$650).

You may study for credit towards a Master's degree/Graduate certificate/Graduate diploma or for audit. If you have not studied at a tertiary level before you can take advantage of the "Professional Attainment" pathway. Scholarships are also available for the year-long Damascus Spiritual Leaders Program at Heart of Life, Melbourne (50% of full cost reimbursed: full cost \$9,816 with tertiary credit). (According to the Heart of Life website the program is closed, however positions are still available for parishioners in the

Sandhurst diocese.)
