December 10th - 2023: The Second Sunday of Advent

We, Wodonga Catholic Parish, acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the land where our churches, schools and buildings are located. We pay our respect to the Aboriginal people and Elders past and present whose spirits dwell in this land. May the spirit of this ancient land be always with us.

<u>Pope Francis:</u>

"Advent is the time we are given to welcome the Lord who comes to encounter us and also to verify our longing for God, to look forward and prepare ourselves for Christ's return".

Looking at the Gospel:

Signs of a true prophet are humility and that the message is greater than the messenger. John the Baptist is the model prophet-precursor, as a prophet his words focus on repentance and as a precursor he comes before Christ but never puts himself in front. He prepares the way for the Lord and prepares the people to receive him. John baptises with water, The Christ will baptise with Holy Spirit.

Mark begins his gospel with the very simple words: "The Beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ the Son of God." What is professed at the beginning is hidden or "Secret" until the end when Jesus shows himself to his disciples as the Risen Lord. The Good News is offered to those who wish to listen. And in listening they come to conversion and discipleship. The mystery of Christ is with us. We come to celebrate this mystery through conversion, witness and love.

The words in the first reading are spoken in the Gospel. Prepare, Shout out and believe the Lord is among us. The image of making a straight path through valleys and mountains is again repeated. This work of levelling is not just topographical but spiritual. We must identify our own depths and heights that prevent the Lord coming into our lives.

<u>Advent Prayer</u>:

With tender comfort and transforming power you come into our midst, O God of mercy and might. Make ready a way in the wilderness, clear a straight path in our hearts, and form us into a repentant people, that the advent of your Son may find us watchful and eager for the glory he reveals. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, whose coming is certain, whose day draws near. Amen.

Advent Customs: Wassailing:

The house-visiting wassail is the practice of people going door-to-door, singing Christmas Carols and offering a drink from the wassail bowl in exchange for gifts; this practice still exists, but has largely been displaced by community carol singing.

2023 Advent Appeal for Ukraine:

A special collection will be taken up This Sunday for the Advent appeal for Ukraine at Sacred Heart Church, Wodonga.

During Advent 2022, Australian dioceses were invited to take up a collection for the people of Ukraine. Hundreds of thousands of dollars was raised to support people in the war-torn nation through the work of Mudra Sprava (Wise Action), Patriarchal Charitable а Foundation in Ukraine. Liturgical Jottings: Blessings: 2-Nativity Scene:

The custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St Francis of Assisi who made the Christmas manger for Christmas eve of 1223.

The blessing may be given during a celebration of the word of God, during Mass, or another service, e.g., a carol service. The blessing of the nativity scene, according to pastoral circumstances, may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another more suitable time.

When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member; the shorter rite may be used for this purpose. A form of this rite is also found in Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers. Book of Blessings: 1541 1542 1545
