Easter is a celebration of life. We celebrate this life by being grateful to God for the gift of life we have and for the gifts of many people who shared their lives, even put their own lives at risk to show that they cared for us, as Jesus has done to us.

May you all have grace-filled Easter time with family, friends, and in faith.

Knights of the Southern Cross - Ashes for Ash Wednesday


On Sunday 9th February we became aware that there were no ashes available for Ash Wednesday. Action was required and on that same afternoon,so with buckets and a shovel, a journey to Corryong in the heart of a bushfire ravaged area became, unfortunately, the ideal place to collect some ash.

Ash was collected near Corryong from the charred remains of trees burnt by the out-of-control wild fire.



Buckets were filled and we enjoyed afternoon tea in Corryong before returning to Wodonga. On Monday the ashes were sieved to remove any large impurities and by the Tuesday the necessary ashes were provided to our parish together with some charred wood.

A meaningful display of the burnt logs and charcoal at the Sacred Heart Church Wodonga on Ash Wednesday symbolised that we were sharing this day in support of our Upper Murray churches who had been impacted by the recent fires. Containers of the blessed ashes were used at the local schools and also travelled with Father Juniun to Corryong and Tallangatta.

Fr Vin Walsh: A Local Product

Father Vin Walsh, a regular supply priest in Wodonga parish over the past summer (and the past few years), mentioned prior to his final blessing in a recent Mass in Wodonga that he had just gone through his scrapbook. He offered a couple of brief reflections on his life and life in general. This prompted an invitation, which he accepted, for him to tell us more in Parish Talk. This is his story.

I was born in Rutherglen, and attended a State School for 12 months before going to Rutherglen Convent School, three miles away. I left school in 1949 and commenced work at the Rutherglen Post Office, and attended a Postal Training School in



Melbourne in 1952. I did national service training in 1953. I worked in various post offices in north-east Victoria for the next ten years. The longest stints were in Bonegilla Migrant Camp and Wodonga.

It was in Wodonga that I was confronted seriously with religion. Prior to that, I had attended Mass, but that was about it. One night in a Wodonga hotel, a couple of fellows I knew asked me to attend the mission being conducted in St. Augustine's, Wodonga. I wasn't all that interested. However, they persisted, so to get them off my back, I went along one night. What the missioner had to say started me thinking about life in general – not specifically in religious terms. I was 27 years old having a great time – plenty of dances, parties and so on. It was quite a comfortable lifestyle, but where was I going? Somehow the great truth that life is not a rehearsal – one only gets one shot at it – became my predominant thought. Later on an idea started to gel in my mind. Why not give religious life a go!

Initially I rejected it. However, after talking to the late Monsignor Tom Awburn (the parish priest), I decided to follow it up. At this time, I was transferred to the Carlton Post Office, which was providential because it enabled me to take on a couple of matriculation subjects - as they were called in those days – to see if I could study again. After 13 years of only studying the form for the race track, it wasn't exactly easy. I successfully got through those subjects and, after a couple of disappointments, I joined the Carmelite novitiate in Sydney in 1966, returned to Melbourne in 1967 and was ordained in Rutherglen on 20th May, 1972 by Bishop Bernard Stewart.

My first appointment was as Assistant Priest at the Cavendish Road parish in Coorparoo (Brisbane). Four years later, in 1976, I was appointed Parish Priest at Wentworthville, in Sydney's western suburbs. In January, 1983, I was appointed to Middle Park (Melbourne) as Parish Priest. As my time in Middle Park was coming to an end, I realised I had become a little nostalgic for country living, still being a country boy at heart. I went to Bendigo in May, 1989, and after supplying at Pyramid Hill, was offered a position at St. Kilian's over Christmas of that year, and remained there for thirteen years.

Since I returned to the north-east, I have continued to do supply weekends in various parishes in the diocese. One big advantage was to be able to spend nigh on every day with my mother who had been a widow for 53 years.

Mass of Anointing Group

In June 1980, a Senior Support Group was formed as a ministry and set up by Sr Eustelle, holding Mass in St Augustine's Church and a cuppa in a room at the convent.



For the Christmas breakup, Sister would invite as many people as she could muster including non-Catholics (whoever wanted to come) with gifts for all.

Fr Hickey came to Wodonga as Parish Priest in 1980. Father, with the help of Sr. Eustelle, organised a meeting in the Parish. Many came, but didn't come back. Father wanted the committee to do more for people in Osborne Lodge and the homebound. Eventually St Augustine's School needed our meeting room for classes. Sr. Borgia was the new principal and she suggested we move to Sacred Heart Church hall. We celebrated many happy milestones in the hall, including Fr Paul's thirty years in the priesthood and twenty-five years of parish work. The Mass was always very well attended.

The group had a change of name on 9th November 2011 to Mass of Anointing Group. The group would concentrate on transporting people to and from our Mass of Anointing with afternoon tea to follow.

Our next move was to the foyer of Sacred Heart Church in 2012, where we would celebrate our Masses in the usual way. We had a lot of help on the day. The men would arrange the tables and chairs. Our group of ladies would set the tables for afternoon tea, prepare an altar for Mass, lectern,

organ, hymn books etc. Mass was celebrated at 1.45pm, followed by afternoon tea, and then parishioners were transported home. This was a special time for parishioners to catch up and have a chat.



Our Mass of Anointing was celebrated for thirtynine years, finishing on 4th December 2019. We celebrated that Mass with three of the original group in attendance, Marie Walsh, Norma McGrath, and Elaine Dalton.



Last year, eighteen new adults and teenagers became Catholics.



We are very flexible with the program, fitting in sessions around candidates' family, work and school commitments. You may not realise how many of your fellow parishioners have joined our Catholic Church through this RCIA program or have been a sponsor to others.

In the past few years we have encountered a significant language barrier with candidates from Bhutan and the Congo. With the assistance of interpreters we have been able to share our stories together.

In our Wodonga Catholic Parish we have been truly enriched and blessed by the many refugees who now call Wodonga home. Their bright attire, cultural music and different foods have provided a learning experience for us. They certainly bring lots of colour.

Timor Mission Update

In the Christmas, 2019 edition of Parish Talk, Lochlan Moffat wrote about a trip that he took in September, 2019 to a village called Aubeon in the Natarbora region of East Timor with his father, Aaron.



Their goal was to do as much as they could to help establish a new school. They carried out various tasks including building two toilets, a bathroom, a kitchen, a 12-metre long pathway, bag lockers, and a fence around the whole school. They also painted all of the classrooms.



Prior to the trip, they also managed to raise just over \$2200 to go to the children's school uniforms. In January, 2020, the school was officially opened. It is clear that these finds were well spent.

Wednesday 18 March 2020

Prayerful greetings to the people of God across Victoria.

This morning the Prime Minister announced that non-essential indoor gatherings will be limited to 100 people, and outdoor events of more than 500 people will be disallowed, effective today. Given the seriousness of COVID-19, we support this measure as being responsible and sensible, and we encourage everyone to follow public safety guidelines respectfully.

The Bishops of the Province of Victoria have given this prayerful and considered reflection, and have determined the following actions:

Immediate suspension of public liturgies, celebrations of the Mass, until further notice.

All other gatherings are suspended. For the clarification of any concerns, please contact Mrs Katrina Strong, PA to the Bishop Tel (03) 5445 3600

We are very aware that this restriction will be particularly difficult for families who are planning liturgies such as funerals, weddings and baptisms. At this time, so long as appropriate precautions are able to be put in place (such as distancing between participants), it may be possible for these liturgies to proceed with a carefully limited congregation. Deferring these liturgies may be an option that is offered to families.

In light of this, all Catholics in Victoria are dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice (canon 1248). We encourage you to continue active participation in the life of the church, through activities such as time in personal and family prayer, reflecting on the Scriptures, making a spiritual communion, or participating in a Mass online (https://melbournecatholic.org.au/Mass or www.wordonfire.org/daily-mass) or Mass on free to air TV channel 10 6:00am Sunday mornings.

We encourage our priests to continue to celebrate Mass for the spiritual good of God's people, the intentions of the faithful and the alleviation of the present crisis. We assure our people that the Mass is being offered for you in our parishes and that while you are not physically present, you still participate spiritually and that you are close to the hearts of your pastors in the Eucharist.

We urge the clergy to make themselves available to visit individuals especially those who are unwell and vulnerable. This includes viaticum and all the opportunities for healing through the Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation.

Again, we encourage you to regularly consult your local websites for further details of local arrangements.

Tomorrow further pastoral guidelines will be shared in the Dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst. Clergy and religious should consult with their Ordinary if any questions remain uncertain.

All of this is happening during the Season of Lent, a time of preparation for the Easter mysteries. While we are invited to be self-sacrificial at this time, we must remember the words of Jesus upon appearing before his disciples after his resurrection: Again and again he said peace be with you (Jn 19:20). Let's not panic, nor be anxious, nor reduce ourselves to caring only for ourselves. This is a time to be sensible, practical, prayerful, and to share Christ's peace with those who are struggling to feel calm and safe.
