# Looking at the Readings:

Each of the Synoptic Gospels concludes with Jesus' departure from earth and from the company of the Eleven. This year, Year A, Matthew's Gospel does not mention the Ascension. It gives the account of the Apostles last meeting with Christ, his command to preach, teach and baptise and his promise that he will be with them to the end of time. The first reading from Luke's Acts of the Apostles gives us a detailed account of the Ascension of Christ, of Jesus word's to them and their actions at the time of his departure and afterwards.

The Second reading, (Ephesians 1:17-23) provides a deeper insight to the event and mystery of the Ascension. It is St Paul at prayer. While a great missionary in action, he is also a theologian and man of contemplation. He is sharing his hope and trust in his Saviour and his words of praise and blessing with us.

# Galilee

Jesus grew up in Nazareth in Galilee, where he started his ministry (Luke 4:14); his first disciples were Galileans; the women of Galilee were the first witnesses to the empty tomb (Luke 23:55-24:8). The Risen Lord said he will meet the Apostles in Galilee (Matt 28:16, Mark16:7). At the Ascension the angels addressed them as "You men from Galilee" (Acts 1:11). The Apostles feet were firmly on the ground, their eyes were fixed upward into the sky when Christ was lifted up. The Apostles started in Galilee, the border region to the Gentiles, preached and baptised in every land but remained lifted up in spirit to the heavenly realm. We, too, here on earth have our spirits and hearts lifted up to the Lord.

# Mary Help of Christians



At the videoconference of the Australian Catholic Bishops last week they passed the motion: "That the Australian Bishops entrust Australia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary under the title Our Lady Help of Christians, seeking her intercession for the safety of all our people especially in this time of COVID-19 pandemic." Mary Help of Christians has been the official patroness of Australia since 1844. Her feast day is 24 May. But this year it coincides with the feast of the Ascension and so is transferred to Monday 25 May.

My dear Parishioners

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

The recent announcement of the Victorian Government to ease some of the restrictions is a welcome news and must have provided relief to many of us.

We can now catch up with our family and friends although still limited to 5 people with social distancing still to be observed.

We can also now return to Church and attend Mass in public once again on weekends and weekdays if you prefer.

However as recommended, **only 10 people** are allowed to be in our public liturgical celebration; plus 3 or no more than 4 people who may be doing specific roles in the liturgy (eg. Lector, Musician/singer, technical assistant, door attendant).

I know many of you loved going to Mass to partake in Holy Communion and just enjoy the company of each other as a community of faith.

Yet to adhere with the directives we are to put some things in place. When you come to Mass, please observe social distancing (1.5 metres) apart. The seats in the Church are marked where you are to sit. Please use the hand sanitiser provided or if you have your own, bring this with you.

If you are feeling unwell (or coughing, sneezing, etc), stay on the side of caution by staying at home.

To facilitate the cleaning of places in the Church that we may be in contact with, we will just be using one entry and exit point.

**At Sacred Heart Church**, we will be using the Main front Doors. These will be opened before the Mass and closed once Mass begins.

Also to be fair with the parishioners we will be using a **booking system**.

As per the bishop's directive when coming to Mass you need to check in. - When booking, Sonni will take down your details. When you arrive at the Church your name will be checked off.

This is for accountability and care for you especially when we need to contact you. Having said this, we respect your privacy as we assure you we abide with our Parish Privacy policy in handling your personal information.

## GOSPEL JOHN MATTHEW 28:16-20



## First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judgeg and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

### **Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23**

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

# Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said,

'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'
