January 3rd - 2021 The Epiphany of The Lord

Pope Francis on the Epiphany:

In the Gospel (Mt 2:1-12), we heard the Magi begin by stating the reason why they have come: "We have seen his star in the East, and have come to worship him" Worship is the end and goal of their journey. Let us ask ourselves this question: Do we find time for worship in our daily schedules and do we make room for worship in our communities? It is up to us, as a Church, to put into practice the words we prayed in today's Psalm: "All the peoples on earth will worship you, O Lord". In worshiping, we too will discover, like the Magi, the meaning of our journey. And like the Magi, we too will experience "a great joy". Pope Francis Homily 6 January 2020

Looking At The Readings:

The Mystery of the Epiphany of the Lord has many layers of meaning for us. An obvious mystery is the identity of the wise men. Who are they? From where do they come? To where do they go? How many are there? What are their nationalities and their names? What do the gifts mean? What star did they follow? Various traditions have supplied some theories concerning kingship, number, names and meaning of the gifts. Old Testament prophecies supply insights. Isaiah and the Responsorial Psalm speak of Kings from the East on camels bearing gifts of gold and frankincense.

Epiphany also reveals the insights into the mystery of the coming of Christ. He brings light to the peoples everywhere: to come and see God's action and presence in their lives. Also celebrating the Epiphany gives us hope and assurance to be sharers in the promises of Christ Jesus. (Second Reading).

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.
