December 27th -2020 - The Holy Family Year B

Pope Francis'

It means caring for one another in our families: husbands and wives first protect one another, and then, as parents, they care for their children, and children themselves, in time, protect their parents

Looking at the Readings:

The Lectionary for the Feast today provides a standard set comprising of readings before the Gospel: Sirach 3:2-6,12-14, Col 3:12-21 or optional sets for cycles B and C. Three Gospels are provided for each Sunday of the three cycles. We look at the optional readings for cycle B today. The miraculous birth of Isaac to Sarah and Abraham, as promised by the three messengers (angels) begins a series of promised births and the covenant culminating in the birth of Christ. The faith of Abraham and Sarah is praised in the second reading from the letter to the Hebrews. By God's initiative, promises and faithfulness to the covenant, Sarah and Abraham respond in faith and humility, Their acceptance is more than mere obedience, but communion with God and readiness to follow God's plan.

Four times the Holy Family are together in the Gospels: Birth of Jesus (Christmas), Flight into Egypt and return (Matt 2 - cycle A), Presentation in the Temple (Luke 2:22-40 cycle B) and Pilgrimage to Jerusalem and the Temple (Luke 2:41-50 cycle C). The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple includes Simeon's great Canticle that recounts God's promise of salvation to his people and a new concept of light to the pagan nations. Like Mary and Joseph we wonder with awe and faith at the prophecy and its implications, yet to be revealed to Jesus' parents. Today parents are invited to wonder and ponder the future with their children.

Feast of the Holy Family

This feast was introduced at the end of the 1800's when marriage laws and family social life were increasingly losing their Christian character in the West. In 1893 this optional feast was introduced into dioceses that requested it. In 1914 it was moved from the third Sunday after Epiphany to 19 January then again in the universal calendar to the Sunday after Epiphany. In 1969 it was moved to Sunday after Christmas. In 1981 three sets of readings came available to both promote and celebrate family values and to recognise Christ's incarnation and life within a human family.

Prayer for the Day

O God, you cradle us at the beginning of life, and embrace us at our journey's end, for you love us as your own. Bind our families together and deepen our faith, that, like the Holy Family of Nazareth, we may grow in wisdom, obedient to your word

December 28th marks the 10th anniversary of the death of our beloved Bishop Joe Grech.

Joseph Angelo Grech (10 December 1948 – 28 December 2010 was a Roman Catholic bishop in Australia. Born in Balzan, Malta on 10 December 1948. After studies in the local schools, he moved to Melbourne, Australia, where he continued his studies. He was ordained a priest on 30th November 1974 in his home town, before returning to Melbourne to take up parish duties.

He became an auxiliary bishop of the Melbourne archdiocese in 1998.

On 8 March 2001, he was appointed the Bishop of Sandhurst, based in the regional Victorian city of Bendigo. He was installed on 27 April and served in that position until his death from a blood disorder on 28 December 2010.

This year we will have Mass at Sacred Heart Church on <u>Monday the 28th of December</u> –<u>9:15am</u> to remember Bishop Joe. We will also gather after this Mass for morning tea as our Parish priest Fr Junjun shares this day as his birthday. <u>Social distancing to be observed</u>.

Liturgical Jottings Christmas Prefaces Part 2

With the three Christmas Prefaces we have another two for this Season: Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord. Both feasts celebrate the manifestation of the Lord. The Epiphany: "For today your reveal the mystery of our salvation in Christ as a light for the nations, ..." The Baptism of the Lord: "For in the waters of the Jordan you revealed with signs and wonders ... you Word dwelling among us." Each Preface includes a call to us: "You made us new" and a mission for us to share with Christ: "to bring the good news to the poor." Each expresses the mystery of the incarnation as a way of life with the Trinity. We give glory to God!
