*I wish to remember all mothers with gratitude and affection, entrusting them to the protection of Mary, our heavenly Mother. Let us also remember those mothers who accompany us from Heaven.*



## Looking at the Readings:

The three readings for this Sunday express the great generosity of God's love and grace. In the Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, abbreviated as it is, God lavishly poured out his grace and Spirit on the people gathered to welcome, listen to and be baptised by Peter. This passage is the conclusion of the earlier passage about Peter's extraordinary vision at Joppa and his request to go to Caesarea (Acts 10:9-23). The reading from the first letter of St John speaks of God's great love for us. "God is Love" and by his love God has given us so great a Saviour.

The Gospel reveals the Great Commandment of Jesus to his disciples: "This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you" & iterated in the final verse: "What I command you is to love one another."

Jesus emphasises the gratuity of the Father's love and his love for his people which he now calls friends: friends that he is willing to lay down his life. The Apostles act upon this love as we hear from Peter in the Acts, and Paul and John in their letters. Today we note that God's love for us finds expression in a mother's love for her children and our love for our mothers.

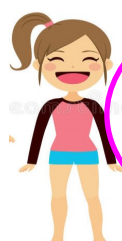
## Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

Each day of the coming month, he said, "the many people who have been affected by the virus, and who continue to suffer the consequences of the pandemic," will be entrusted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, "Mother of Mercy."

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you.
