Focus on the Readings

The first reading from Deuteronomy (Greek meaning Second Law) is a summary of the ten commandments. Verses 6:4-9 have been regarded as a declaration of faith for the Hebrew people. Today the orthodox Jews take quite literally 6:8 "Bind these words as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead," by attaching the text on their foreheads and forearms in small pouches called tefillin or phylacteries.

The text was also recited in their daily morning and evening prayer acknowledging their devotion to the one true God, a God of love. The "Shema" prayer has a similar status to the Christian Lord's Prayer also prayed morning and evening acknowledging God as our loving Father.

So the text would be very familiar both to Christ and the scribe (lawyer) who asked the question in today's Gospel passage. Christ added a new line: "and you shall love your neighbour as yourself" Mark 12:31 and also from the Torah in Leviticus 18:19,34

The scribe's encounter with Christ was amicable and serene, Jesus response wise and deep. We are all called to that deeper relationship with God peacefully and confidently.

All Saints & All Souls Day:

Please join us Monday—November 1st as we celebrate All Saints Day with Mass at Sacred Heart Church, Wodonga at 9:15am and 6:00 pm

All Souls day will be celebrated with Mass at Sacred Heart Church Wodonga At 9:15am and 6:00pm on Tuesday the 2nd of November. While no longer Holy Days of Obligation in Australia, All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day are both special celebrations. All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated on 1 November on which the Church commemorates all the saints in heaven.

The feast dates back to the early Church, when communities would gather and celebrate the anniversary of the martyr's death.

During the persecution under the emperor Diocletian at the beginning of the fourth century the number of martyrs

became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each saint, so the Church established a common feast day for all the martyrs.

All Saints Day represents the desire of the faithful to commemorate all saints, 'great multitude which no man could number' (Rev 7:9), especially those who have no proper feast day of their own. All Saints' Day is a time to consider the example saints offer us and to reflect on how we can imitate their lives. As Pope Benedict XVI said, All Saints' Day calls us 'to see the Church; as Christ wanted it, that is, as the communion of saints.'

All Souls' Day follows **All Saints Day** on 2 November and is also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead. It is a day of prayer and remembrance for the souls of those who have died. Believers remember, pray and offer Mass for the souls in Purgatory, that they may be purified and attain the Beatific Vision. **All Souls Day** originally was celebrated in the Easter season, around Pentecost Sunday.

Liturgical lottings: Ordinary Numbers

Ordinary numbers are used to tell the order in a sequence, example first, second, third, or thirty-first. Hence the numbering of Sundays in Ordinary Time. Cardinal numbers are used to count the number in a set, example one, two or ten etc. Hence we have nine Eucharistic prayers in the Roman Missal and three for Masses with Children. The sequence of days in the month to coincide with sequence of Sundays in Ordinary Time is not common. Today we have the 31st October on the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. The last concurrence was 26th September 2021, the second last time was 15th July and 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time in 2018. This concurrence has happened 20 times since 10th August 2000 and thrice for the 1st Sunday of Advent to fall on 1st Dec in 2002, 2013, and 2019 and four times in Lent on the 1st March with 1st Sunday of Lent in 2009 and 2020 and 3rd March with 3rd Sunday of Lent in 2002 and 2013.
