A Christmas Message:

My dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Merry Christmas.

I pray that our Christmas celebration this year is indeed a happy one, as we can now freely celebrate with our family and friends, without the stress and the anxiety of breaking any restrictions.

But our Christmas would even be more meaningful if we start at the real reason for

Let us remember in our prayers this time, those our brothers and sisters in many parts of the world, whose Christmas is not as joyous as they'd hope it to be and are suffering by reason of war and conflicts, by persecution and violence, and by the persistent threat and presence of Coronavirus.

Let us pray for those who have lost someone in death because of Covid19 or other illnesses, especially in this time of the year, when family get together is always something worth looking forward to and wonderful to have.

Let us pray for those countries still struggling to cope up with this Covid19 Pandemic.

Let us pray for those who are being displaced and seeking asylum that world leaders and countries may offer them a space in the inn of their hearts.

Let us pray for those who are to bear the effects of natural disasters and man-made violence in many parts of the world.

Let us pray for our families that we may all stay safe and well and ready to face the new year with confidence, hope and optimism. May our families welcome Christ into our homes and be given a space in the inn of our hearts, so as to honour Jesus who is the real reason for this season.

Let us altogether pray and work for peace, starting in our own lives by forgiving those who have wronged us, by being generous with our time, talent and resources to those in need, and by bringing Christ and his message of peace, joy and love to
