## January 2nd - 2022 The Epiphany of The Lord

## **Epiphany:**

Epiphany is the earliest Christmas feast, originating in the East in the third century and passing to the West in the fourth century. A celebration of the divine "coming," or "manifestation" in the East it commemorates the baptism of the Lord and in the West the visit of the Magi (wise men). Epiphany is the customary time for the blessing of homes.

## **Looking At The Readings**

Each year we have the same readings for the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord - no cycle A, B or C. An obvious reason is the account of the wise men coming to Bethlehem is only recorded in one gospel, the Gospel according to Matthew. This evangelist is keen to make the link between Christ and the royal line of David. David was a born in Bethlehem, began as a shepherd and became a king to guide the people Israel. The identity of wise men are hidden from the reader purposefully to emphasise the new king born for us is for all nations. The Child Jesus is not just shown to a select group but to ones representing the peoples of the world. And indeed the whole world holds this feast as a celebration of Christ coming among them.

The Prophet Isaiah, as with the other prophets contemplates on present events and give visions of new quasi-events when retribution, new order, salvation or re-creation will take place. Here Isaiah speaks of the glory of God becoming manifest .in a new age. St Paul in the second reading speaks of the promises of God revealed in Christ are for all generations and all believers and those yet to come to faith.

What Matthew omits from his Gospels future generations of believers have imagined: Let us imagine not the titbits of minutia but the importance for us today to find, celebrate God our salvation

## Pope Francis on the Christmas Crib III

On the feast of Epiphany we place the statues of the Three Kings in the Christmas crib. Observing the star, those wise men from the East set out for Bethlehem, in order to find Jesus and to offer him their gifts. As we contemplate this aspect of the nativity scene, we are called to reflect on the responsibility of every Christian to spread the Gospel. Each of us is called to bear glad tidings to all, testifying by our practical works of mercy to the joy of knowing Jesus and his love. The Magi teach us that people can come to Christ by a very long route. Men of wealth, sages from afar, athirst for the infinite, they set out on the long and perilous journey that would lead them to Bethlehem (cf. Mt 2:1-12). Great joy comes over them in the presence of the Infant King. They are not scandalized by the poor surroundings, but immediately fall to their knees to worship him.
