April 17th - 2022 Easter Sunday

"This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

Sisters and brothers in the Risen Lord!

Parishioners in Wodonga, Tangambalanga, Dederang, Mt Beauty, Tallangatta, Corryong, Walwa, Sandy Creek and Mitta Mitta: Happy Easter!

Indeed, Easter is the day that the Lord has made, and so we rejoice.

We rejoice because of Jesus Christ, the Holy One of God who shows us that suffering and death in life, don't have the final say in our lives, the resurrection has the final say.

But there is more reason to rejoice.

Jesus is HOLY. He is 'Head Over heels in Love with You'.

The greatest proof of this is Jesus' death on the Cross.

Friends, God loves us so much that he would do anything for us.

On the night of his Last Supper, the day before he died, he presents to us his Last Will- he left us a lasting memory of himself- his body and blood for our souls.

He forgives us 70 times 7 times even if we deny him to our friends as Peter has denied him.

On Good Friday, he carries the Cross for us. He suffered being mocked, being spat upon, being flogged for our sins.

He offers us 'paradise' even if we only come back to him at the last minute of our lives as he had assured the repentant thief.

He makes excuses for us and asks the Father's forgiveness on our behalf, when we 'don't know what we are doing'.

He carries the Cross for us and even walks the way for us when we feel we can never keep on going.

He loves us so much that for Jesus 'we are to die for'.

On Easter Sunday, Jesus shows us that 'we are worth all his sacrifice'.

This is a reason to rejoice indeed, a reason to really have a Happy Easter.

But as Christians we are also called to share the joys of Easter to others.

How? To love like Jesus.

Jesus prayed for forgiveness for those who didn't know what they were doing.

Like Jesus, let us pray that those who caused war and conflicts in some parts of the world, who seem to be indifferent to the sufferings of those affected by war, may come to their senses of the evil they have done and put an end to their evil desires.

Jesus invited those who are tired and weighed heavily by life's burdens and offered them rest.

Like Jesus, let us be mindful to those who are weighed down by life's trials, especially those who are affected by the floods in NSW and Queensland and in others parts of Australia. In the best way we can, let us endeavour to offer our support to them so as to give them 'rest' and comfort from their grief and loss of their properties, businesses, income, etc. Let us also pray and offer our support to those who are suffering from the effects of natural disasters in many parts of the world. Let us pray for those who are struggling and finding life burdensome.

Jesus gave chance another glance at Peter and a second chance to the repentant thief.

Like Jesus, let us also give another glance at people whom we may not like, whom we may not like to be associated with, those who may have done wrong to us, and whose presence we may not be comfortable to be around with, and listen to their personal stories. At times, we can be this kind of people, yet Jesus has given us another us another glance, another chance.

Sisters and brothers in the Risen Lord, Christ is Head Over heels in Love with You (Holy). May we be "Holy" for Him too for it is in loving him, by loving like him, and by loving others as he loved them that our life eternal is assured.
