Our Parish History - St Joseph's Church Mt Beauty

St. Josephs Church Mt. Beauty.



St. Josephs, Mt. Beauty was consecrated on November 7th 1954, at that time St. Josephs belonged to the parish of Bright that had been formed in 1948..The earliest records we have is a family from Kilkenny in Ireland, Thomas and Elizabeth Crotty who took over the Bogong Hotel in Tawonga in about 1893. It is believed Mass was celebrated at the hotel or community hall from this period. There were 14 baptisms recorded as being Tawonga residents between 1939 and 1947. There must have been others prior to this but no record can be found.

With the start of the Kiewa hydro Electricity scheme and the increase in population, Masses were said in various schools, homes and public halls at Mt. Beauty and Tawonga. At that time Masses were said by Father John Hussey, who was Parish Priest from 1948 to 1951. Father Hussey's first Masses were celebrated in Tawonga South School, now the National Parks office in Tawonga South. Masses were then conducted every two weeks in Tawonga school. At this time Leo and Bidy Reid were the driving force for the proposal for a Catholic Church at Mt. Beauty. Leo was employed by the State Electricity Commission as a Building Construction Foreman. Father Hussey used the Reid's kitchen to hear confessions on the Saturday evenings prior to Mass. The SECV allocated a block of land to each denomination for a place of worship during the planning of the township of Mt. Beauty. Father Hussey called a meeting after Mass to discuss the erection of a church. Several parishioners immediately donated money towards this project. A building committee chaired by Leo Reid was immediately formed and monies were raised via various methods including the raffling of a Holden motor car and the issuing of debentures redeemable in three years time. The church was expected to cost between three and four thousand pounds, by February 1954 the proceeds from various functions and activities passed the half way mark to raise these funds. The entire project was undertaken by volunteer labour, utilising the many skills of the labour force employed in the construction of the hydro electric scheme. St. Josephs was opened debt free by Bishop Bernard Stewart on Sunday 7th November 1954. The total cost was four thousand pounds and had taken 18 months to complete.

The Priests Flat and Meeting Room: The meeting room and flat next to the church became essential because the Priest would travel from Bright over the mountain on the Saturday afternoon to prepare for Mass at Mt. Beauty on the Sunday. In the short term, while funds were being raised a house was rented for the use of the Priest from the SECV and was referred to as the "temporary Parish House."

The Parish flat and meeting rooms were built during 1959 and comprised a sitting room, kitchenette, bedroom, toilet and bathroom. Two extra toilets were added to cater for parishioners. The Church extension was constructed by contract, during the later part of 1978 to cater for an extra fifty people; this extension was blessed and opened by Bishop Daly on Sunday 2nd December 1979. The reconciliation room at the rear of the church was added in 1991.
