

Pope Francis on CARE for our EARTH:

The Australian Catholic Bishops encourage each Catholic parish, diocese, eparchy, educational institution and organisation to join the Laudato Si' Action Platform by 2024 and develop a Laudato Si' Action Plan. Wodonga Catholic Parish has joined this action platform, however, we need a small team of volunteers to head up this valuable ministry.

Here is an Inspiring idea: In an effort to reduce the amount of olives going to waste in their parish and parishioners' gardens, Echuca Parish has worked with Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning students to pick olives and take them to Apulia Grove Olives at Tooleen for pressing. The Echuca Parish Care for Creation Team refill olive oil bottles saved by parishioners who then pay for their oil, which covers the cost of pressing. Looking at the Readings:

Two parables about vineyards in the readings today both end in disaster. From the prophet Isaiah, the property is fitted out, the vineyard is properly planted and tended but produces sour and bad grapes and then destroyed. Jesus' parable tells of a similar building, planting and tending, but this time the harvest is good but the owner is robbed of its produce and his son is killed by the workers he trusted. Australian wine makers reflect another twist to this fragile industry when their great produce faces uncertain markets.

In the first parable, the vineyard is the image of God's people, or as expressed in the Responsorial Psalm: "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel." In the second parable the owner's son is an image of Jesus, the workers who rejected the son are the ones Jesus addressed the parable to: "the chief priests and the elders of the people."

Today, "the Church receives the parable as an admonition addressed to itself. It cannot fail to do so because Matthew has too consistently insisted on the necessity of bearing fruit. The Church will be faithful to its mission and election only if it welcomes the prophets whom God does not cease to send it, only if it practices the gospel of his Son, only if it remains faithful through everything. The vineyard song still resounds in today's Church: Master of the vineyard, do not reject the work of your hands." (Year of the Lord Vol.4 p.213)

Feast of the Week-Saint John Henry Newman Oct 9th.

As an Anglican clergyman for over 20 years he was renown as a preacher, theologian and one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement. On 9th of October 1845 he was received into the Catholic Church and ordained priest on 30 May 1847. He was an influential writer on many subjects: The development of Christian doctrine, the true understanding of conscience, faith and reason, the role of the laity, and university education and author of several hymns. John Henry Newman died in 1890 and canonised in 2019.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people:

'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way.

Finally he sent his son to them.

"They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance."

So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him.

Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.'

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone.
