Pope Francis: Homily at the Opening Mass of the Synod.



"The Holy Spirit often shatters our expectations to create something new that surpasses our predictions and negativity. Let us open ourselves to him and call upon him, the protagonist, the Holy Spirit. And let us walk with him, in trust and with joy."

A Message from Fr Junjun: (Received Monday 9th of October)

Good day my dear Parishioners,

Just an update from here in Jerusalem.

You may have heard about the news of war in Israel.

At the moment we are safe and sound here in Tantur Ecumenical Institute, where I reside and study, but we are told to be always ready and hurry to the 'Air Raid' shelter when the sirens are sounded again.

Last Saturday, sirens signalling rocket missile attacks were all over the place. Israeli's iron dome was able to intercept more than 2000 of the Hamas' 5000 rockets being launched. One rocket got through and hit 3 kilometres from Tantur institute.

We, the residents here were told to stay in the Air Raid shelter within the building all morning as the explosions went on. We could still hear some explosions from afar, the fighting is still on. Today, from where I am, the roads are eerily quiet. The Ministry of Tourism advised that all residents are to stay in doors or near the building and ready to find shelter when missiles are fired again.

I am due to depart Israel Sunday, October 15th. I hope and pray the airport will be secured and flights returned by then. For now I know many flights in and out are cancelled or delayed. Our director here in Tantur mandated that we all stay in the premises.

It's relatively calm now, but every moment is unpredictable. We pray this will not last long, for many civilians from both sides have now been affected, houses destroyed and family members killed.

I trust your prayers for all of us here. *Fr Junjun*

Looking at the Readings:

The liturgy of the word opens with Isaiah's image of the Day of the Lord when all will be fulfilled. People will gather in the presence of God for a banquet that is more magnificent than any royal banquet or wedding feast. All suffering, mourning and sorrows will also end. We understand why this reading is also popular for funerals for it offers a vision of heaven with the best of everything. The responsorial psalm (also used at funerals) complements the readings. The response also reinforces this sense: "I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life." We are invited into God's presence and enjoy his comfort and great largess. The Gospel is the third parable in a sequence addressed to the chiefs priests and the elders of the people (The two sons, Matt 21:28-32, 26th Sunday; the landowner and the wicked tenants Matt 21:33-43, 27th Sunday; the wedding feast and the guest not dressed appropriately, Matt 22:1-14, 28th Sunday that is today). We should not fall into the trap and say those nasty people, we know better and we behave correctly. Yet Jesus' words are still relevant to people today. We are God's holy people, we are baptised and participate in the church's mission and worship. Can these words of warning to the leaders apply to us today? All types of people are invited to the feast God has prepared. Many refuse to listen and accept. There is the odd one who says "Yes" but refuses to change his old habits. God is offering a lot, asking little and ready to help those in need.

We welcome and congratulate candidates and families as they celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism this weekend.

Part 1: What is "Team Ministry" in a Parish Setting:

Bishop Shane has indicated that Fathers Andrew Fewings, John Paul Pasala and Adi Indra will not be Parish Priests or Assistant Priests in Wodonga, Tallangatta & Corryong parishes, but instead "Pastoral Leaders & Team Members" in a "Team Ministry". You might be wondering, what does this mean?

Canon Law says, "When circumstances require it, the pastoral care of a parish or of different parishes together can be entrusted to several priests in solidum", in exercising pastoral care one of them must be the moderator, namely, the one who is to direct the joint action and to answer for it to the Bishop" (can. 517 § 1).

In the 'classic' parish model, the Parish Priest is the one responsible not only to direct pastoral care & initiatives, but also to carry them out himself. The presence of an assistant priests is to help & support the Parish Priest in performing his duties.

In this ministry model introduced after Vatican II, the three priests will act in solidum, which could be loosely translated as "in a team" or "jointly." Fathers Andrew, John Paul & Adi will have approximately equal duties & responsibilities as team members. The focus area of each priest, however, will be different, hence the team needs one Moderator to coordinate pastoral care & initiatives & to answer for it to Bishop Shane.

In practice, the new model of ministry will not be much different for the people of God in each parish. Pastoral care will still go on as normal & hopefully it will even be improved.





SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops

The Opening Mass for the Synod on Synodality on 4 October, commenced with a procession of Synod participants through St Peter's Square.

The pageantry was fitting for this historic Synod in which lay men and women have been granted full voting rights for the first time; and the submissions of everyday Catholics – from what has been an unprecedented scale of global consultation will be formally considered.

For the next three weeks, Synod participants, including Bishop Shane Mackinlay and eleven others from Australia, will meet in the Vatican's Paul VI Hall to engage in conversations of the spirit and eventually advise Pope Francis on the theme:

Pope Francis asked participants "to walk together with the gaze of Jesus". He said, when each one of us keeping the gaze of Jesus, the Church grows as one with God firmly at the centre; it reaches out to the world; 'stirs the indifferent'; remains true to the teachings of Jesus and does not lose heart – even in amid the 'sometimes agitated waves of our time'.

A Prayer for the Synod

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and remain faithful to the way of truth and what is right.
