Focus on the Gospel:

It is not easy to recognise a true prophet. Frequently those with prophetic insight are treated without honour. The people to whom Ezekiel was sent were hard of face, obstinate of heart, a rebellious house. The Galileans who heard Jesus' words were no better. They questioned his authenticity because they thought he was no better than they were and, therefore, he had no right to act superior. We so often resent people who can do what we cannot. This resentment can be magnified when the person is someone with whom we have grown up, a member of the family or of the community.

True believers recognise and admit their human frailty. They know that genuine weakness does not impede the saving action of God. God seems to prefer to act where pride and self-satisfaction do not prevail, for such attitudes are obstacles to personal transformation. However, when we open ourselves in humility and honest piety, the power of God can flood our minds and hearts and shine forth from us to all around. There will be no doubt in any mind as to the origin of this wondrous reality. It will be very clear that though it comes through us, it comes from God. The receptivity of Paul in this matter is in sharp contrast to the rebellion of the people at the time of Ezekiel and the resistance of those who thought that they knew Jesus so well. © Dianne Bergant CSA

Are you unable to attend Mass or do you have a family member who is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Eucharist?



Liturgical Jottings - "Son of Man"

The Prophet Ezekiel is called by God to go to the rebel Israelites to preach to them. The Lord calls Ezekiel: "Son of man." This title is used 87 times for Ezekiel in the book but in two senses: he is set apart from others for a special mission to bring the Word of God to others. Yet he is not God but human, a son of man, it is a down to earth expression. However, Daniel is the only other prophet given this title. In Dan 7:13 & 8:17 the title expresses that Daniel is greater than others; it also has Messianic overtones. Jesus adopts this title in addressing himself as the "Son of Man" more than any other title. This expression appears in the liturgy eleven times but only in the Communion Antiphons e.g.: "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.
