World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 28 July 2024: Message from Pope Francis

Theme: "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Ps 71:9). God never abandons his when children, never. Even our age advances and our powers decline, when our hair grows white and our role in society lessens, when our lives become less productive and can risk appearing useless. On this World Day devoted to them, let us show our tender love for the grandparents and the elderly members of our families. Let us spend time with those who are disheartened and no longer hope in the possibility of a different future. To all of you, dear grandparents and elderly persons, and to all those who are close to you I send my blessing, accompanied by my prayers. And I ask you, please, not to forget to pray for me.

Focus on the Gospel:

The readings from the Gospel according to Mark are interrupted from today until the 21st Sunday in Ordinary time (25 August). The Gospel of John, Chapter 6 (69 verse) are proclaimed in these five Sundays. Each week an Old Testament reading is chosen to complement the Gospel. It is interesting to follow this sequence and to discern the reasoning behind these selections. At the same time Jesus moves the minds and spirits of the people from the material to the spiritual, from the physical to the sacramental. Within chapter six there are many quotes from the Hebrew texts linking the events of their history of salvation to the present and then linking the present age to the promise of everlasting life in eternity. Today we hear of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. There are many allusions to the Eucharistic meal in this chapter and three in this week's Gospel: 1. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover; 2. [Jesus] knew exactly what he was going to do 3. Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out. Healing the sick and feeding the people are signs of the Messiah among his people. He is offering life and life to the full. Let us journey with the apostles and the crowd in these coming weeks.

John 6:1-15								
Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
