At least once a day we find ourselves eating together; perhaps in the evening with our family, after a day of work or study. It would be lovely, before breaking bread, to invite Jesus, the bread of Life, to ask him simply to bless what we have done and what we have failed to do. Let us invite him into our home; let us pray at home. Jesus will be at the table with us and we will be fed by a greater love. (Angelus Address 8/8/2021)

Focus on the Readings:

The Gospel reaches a turning point this week in Jesus' discourse on the bread of life. The crowd that was eager to follow and listen to him is now complaining about his teaching. Referring to the bread which God provided in the desert, the manna from heaven, Jesus is offering a new type of bread. Both cases need to be understood as the revelation of God: God is revealing himself to his people and providing for their needs, both worldly as in the desert and spiritually in this isolated place. Thus, the emphasis is on listening, seeing, believing the revelation of the Father through Jesus Christ.

Jesus' teaching - his Word - is the bread they need for life, yet they find it difficult to understand. To understand Jesus as a gift, given by the Father. The Father's gift reveals or uncovers the mysteries. Here they are the mysteries of God's Word and the Eucharist. The readings present symbolic language, firstly by the bread, and then by the Elijah's forty days in the desert (1 Kings 19:8) and the Israelites forty years in desert (Exodus and John 6:49). Later in the disocures Jesus adopts "sacramental language" when he promises to give us living bread: "the bread that I shall give you is my flesh" (John 6:51). We are invited to come to Jesus in faith and love.

Text for the Week:

As God's dear children, then, take Christ as your pattern, and live in love just as Christ loved us, giving himself up for us as an offering and sweet-smelling sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:1-2, quoting Exodus 29:18. RNJB
