# The Gospel

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

**A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all people shall see the salvation of God** (Luke 3:1-6).

In a desert wilderness, far from centres of power and influence, a new age of God's coming into world history is announced. John the Baptist speaks for God who longs for our change of heart, calling all to repentance and sorrow for sin. It is time to prepare a way for the One who brings forgiveness, reconciliation and salvation. He will fulfil the true hopes and dreams for the human family and all creation.

**"... uncertainty about the future** may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt. Often we come across people who are discouraged, pessimistic and cynical about the future, as if nothing could possibly bring them happiness. For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope. God's word helps us find reasons for that hope" (Pope Francis, *Spes Non Confundit*, #1).

**We need to recognise the immense goodness present in our world,** lest we be tempted to think ourselves overwhelmed by evil and violence.

The signs of the times, which include the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope


