Gospel John 8:1-11

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives.

At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning.

What have you to say?'

They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him.

But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger.

As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said,

'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.'

Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again.

When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there.

He looked up and said,

'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?'

'No one, sir,' she replied.

'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'

Looking at the Readings

The Gospel today begins at the Mount of Olives. This place is mentioned eleven times in the Gospels, often as a place where Jesus prayed alone or sometimes with a few disciples. At the beginning of Lent, Jesus taught us to pray (Ash Wednesday, Tuesday, first week of Lent). After prayer Jesus went to the Temple to teach.

We heard that the scribes and pharisees wanted to trap Jesus. They must have been waiting at the temple, knowing he would come that way. They were ready with the accused and their tricky question. It was a three way trap: If he were to say, let her go he would go against the Law. If he were to say let her receive the prescribed punishment he showed no mercy and guilt of a crime. And thirdly, either response would have discredited him before the people. Commentators also add that stoning to death, despite several scenes in popular movies, was not practiced in that era, it was against Roman law.

Jesus, after dispelling the accusers, is moved to compassion. And confronted by Jesus' compassion, the woman is in a somewhat quandary. This passage ends abruptly just like the parable last week. Did the older brother, urged by his father, go to the party? Did the women take to heart the mercy of God and amend her life? What are our attitudes to those who do wrong? The sudden endings leave us to ponder what would be our response to God's reaching out to us in mercy. We may be moved to hear more the words of Jesus in the Gospel and to prayer and celebrate the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist

A significant portion of chocolate available in Australia is produced using cocoa beans harvested by child labourers, many of whom endure enslavement and exploitative working conditions.


Indulge responsibly, select ethically sourced chocolate, and support companies working towards eliminating slavery from their supply chain this Easter.
