## From Our Pope:

9 May 2025 — "God loves us, God loves you all, and evil will not prevail! "We are disciples of Christ.. "We must seek together how to be a missionary Church".

#### Looking at the Readings

The earlier chapters of Acts of the Apostles show St Peter leading the infant Church in Jerusalem, the later chapters recount the mission of Paul to the gentiles. Both Apostles were imprisoned for preaching the Risen Christ, both had miraculous escapes: Peter had a dreamlike walk through the guards, Paul's cell was opened by an earthquake. Even their prisons became pulpits, other prisoners and the gaolers listened to their words, witnessed their faith and sought baptism.

The Second Reading testifies Paul's faith at the close of his life and mission. The Gospel passage reveals the faith and the commission of Peter at the beginning of his ministry. Each text shows that faith is a gift of God and faith demands action.

St Peter's exclamation: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" Jesus seems in admiration, if not actual surprise at this remarkable profession of faith. Several times Jesus is in praise and in thanksgiving of people's responses to his questions, demands and simply his words. May we find various ways to express our faith and "hear" God's praise and thanksgiving.

#### Liturgical Jottings: Feast of Ss Peter & Paul

The oldest liturgical calendar that has come down to us goes back to 354 AD in Rome. A Chronographer mentioned the celebration of Peter "in the catacombs" and Paul "on the Ostian Way" on June 29. It links the celebration of this feast to the consulate of Tuscus and Sassus, at Rome in 258. Several sermons of Augustine (354-430) attested that this feast rapidly spread throughout the West beginning in Africa.

Peter and Paul are the two pillars of the Church, one the shepherd of Christ's flock governing from his "chair" at Rome, the other the missionary, "Apostle of the Nations" founding and strengthening ecclesial communities all over the world emphasizing the diversity and unity of the Church.

#### Most Reverend Shane Mackinlay

Pope Leo XIV has appointed Most Reverend Shane Mackinlay, currently the eighth Bishop of Sandhurst, as the new Archbishop of Brisbane. Bishop Mackinlay will replace Archbishop Mark Coleridge, who is retiring after 13 years as the Archbishop of Brisbane and 51 years as a priest.

### A Statement from Bishop Shane Mackinlay

I am deeply honoured by Pope Leo's decision to appoint me as Archbishop of Brisbane – a diocese that has such a strong tradition of fostering the liturgical, spiritual, evangelising and educational endeavours of the Catholic community, both within the Archdiocese and more broadly.

I am particularly pleased that I will be following Archbishop Mark Coleridge, who has been a friend and mentor to me for many years. In his thirteen years as Archbishop of Brisbane, he has led the Archdiocese with great conviction and generosity, as well as making a very significant contribution to the Church beyond the Archdiocese. In particular, I see the Action Plans that he promulgated after last year's Archdiocesan Synod as providing a clear direction for the Church in Brisbane, as we seek to develop a more synodal Church that effectively proclaims Jesus' good news in our contemporary world. I look forward to working to implement those plans, in collaboration with all who contributed to the process of developing them.

Since I became the Bishop of Sandhurst nearly six years ago, I have been greatly encouraged and inspired by the lively faith and commitment of the people, priests and communities of the Diocese, and by the generous friendship and welcome they have offered to me personally. I am grateful to have shared in the pilgrim journey of the People of God here, where we have together begun new initiatives in living out our mission as Jesus' disciples. While I will be sad to move on from the Sandhurst Diocese, I am excited by this opportunity to serve the broader Church in a new way.

I ask for your prayerful support for me, for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, and for the Diocese of Sandhurst, as I prepare to take up this ministry.
