Hope is Source of Joy no matter our Age

In his Message for the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly; celebrated each year on the Sunday nearest the feast of Jesus' grandparents, Sts Anne and Joachim—Pope Leo reflects on hope and old age.

Pope Leo writes that "hope is a constant source of joy, whatever our age", adding, "when that hope has also been tempered by fire over the course of a long life, it proves a source of deep happiness." In his Message for the Day, Pope Leo offers a scriptural meditation on old age, beginning with biblical figures such as Abraham and Sarah, Zechariah & Elizabeth, as well as Moses, all of whom were called

in old age to be part of God's saving plan.

Looking at the Readings

It is interesting how the Lectionary places the first reading with the Gospel for this week. In the former Abraham is bartering with God. It seems to be with some humour or even relish reminiscence of an oriental marketplace. In the Gospel the disciples ask Jesus how to pray. Does prayer imply a degree of bartering with God? Yet another aspect of prayer is evident in the first reading and the Gospel, that is persistence. Abraham persisted in seeking to spare destruction on the city. Abraham approached God boldly but he spoke as speaking to a friend. In the Gospel another friend persisted in knocking on the door and asking for bread. In the Lord's Prayer Jesus invites us to call God "Father". This familiar term is deeply embedded in the relationship between God and Jesus, and we can observe this relationship between God and Abraham.

The attributes of prayer that we glean from the readings are a sense of dialogue with God, confidence in questioning and bartering with God, a large degree of persistence, readiness to search, trustfulness and faithfulness. But with Christ, St Paul, St Therese and many others, they teach us that love is above all. Prayer both requires and generates a loving relationship with God and one another.

Luke 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.'

He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.

And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it to him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. 'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him, what father among

you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil,

know how to give your children what is good,

how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him
